QUINTE CONSOLIDATED COURTHOUSE PROJECT ATTRACTS INDUSTRY INTEREST

BELLEVILLE – Infrastructure Ontario and the Ministry of the Attorney General announced today the three companies that have been short-listed to design, build, finance and maintain the Quinte Consolidated Courthouse.

The new facility, to be located in Belleville, Ontario, at Coleman and Bridge Streets, will improve access to courthouse services by consolidating the Superior Court of Justice and Ontario Court of Justice, which are currently operating in three locations in Belleville and one in Trenton. Consolidating local courthouses into a single location will provide a new, modern and accessible courthouse to the community. As well, it will reduce costs and provide a more effective use of resources.

Based on a request for qualifications (RFQ) process that began in August 2009, and following evaluations, three top ranking companies were short-listed and will be invited to submit proposals for the project in May 2010. The short-listed companies are:

- **Brookfield Partnerships Quinte** consisting of Brookfield Financial; Halsall Associates Ltd.; Hidi Rae Consulting Engineers; Modern Niagara Ottawa Inc.; Morguard Investments Ltd.; PCL Constructors Canada Inc.; Plan Group Inc.; The Mitchell Partnership Inc.; and WZMH Architects.
- **Carillion Courthouse Solutions** consisting of +VG Toronto, Carillion Canada Inc.; Carilion Construction Inc.; Carillion Private Finance; HOK Architects; MMM Group; Sprint insight; and Univex Group of Companies.

“This is an important step forward for court services in our community,” said Leona Dombrowsky, MPP for Prince-Edward Hastings. “The Quinte Consolidated Courthouse will be a large construction project which will create jobs and help boost our economy.”

The remaining pre-qualified company will be reserved to replace any of the short-listed bidders should they be unable to participate. The remaining pre-qualified company is:

- **Quinte Infrastructure Partners** consisting of Fengate Capital Management Ltd.; Bondfield Construction Company Limited; SNC-Lavalin Operations & Maintenance Inc.; and NORR Limited.

Infrastructure Ontario is working with the Ministry of the Attorney General to develop the facility. Infrastructure Ontario is a Crown corporation dedicated to managing some of the province's larger and more complex infrastructure renewal projects – ensuring they are built on time and on budget.
